

Standards for Students' Dress, Appearance, Manners, and Behavior

Passed at the Student Affairs Committee Meeting on May 17, 2007

1. Clothing: Students should dress simply, tidily, modestly, and in an aesthetically pleasing way. Students must dress according to any other regulations put forth by this institution.
2. Appearance: Students should keep a simple appearance and keep their hair tidy.
3. Manners:
 1. Whether students are on or off campus, students should treat their instructors, classmates, and friends with respect, maintaining a sincere attitude, and showing warmth and respect.
 2. Students should knock before entering a room, and wait for a reply before entering.
4. Language:
 1. Students should speak in an amiable and gentle manner, and should not argue loudly.
 2. Students should not say anything that goes contrary to the well-being of citizens in this country. They should not say anything that affects the well-being of the group, slander others, or spread rumors.
5. Behavior:
 1. Students should always act in a reasonable manner, show a high level of education, and never negatively influence the well-being of another person or the larger group.
 2. Students should protect public property, conserve water and electricity, and return things that have been borrowed.
 3. Students should not enter areas that are off-limits.
 4. In relationships with the opposite sex, students should maintain a respectful and friendly manner, and should be neither rude nor too intimate.
6. Upon being passed at the Student Affairs Committee Meeting and approved by the president, these standards were announced and implemented.
